Cool Coal Man powers to victory in Fountain of Youth

Well positioned throughout, Cool Coal Man charged to the lead at the top of the stretch with just enough in reserve to fend off a late charge from Elysium Fields and triumph by a half-length in the \$350,000 Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) on Sunday at Gulfstream Park.

The Fountain of Youth was the first stakes victory for the three-year-old Mineshaft colt, who completed 1½ miles in 1:50.07 to best a particularly deep field of Triple Crown hopefuls.

COOL COAL MAN

Cool Coal Man won for the fourth time in his previous five starts. He entered the Fountain of Youth off a one-length allowance victory on January 26, also at 1½ miles on the main track at Gulfstream.

His lifetime mark now stands at four wins in seven starts with earnings of \$307,531.

Bred in Kentucky by a partnership that includes William S. Farish and E.J. Hudson Jr., the bay colt sold for \$200,000 at the 2006 Keeneland September yearling sale. In March 2007, the colt was listed as a reserve not attained on a final bid of \$850,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale of selected two-year-olds in training.

Cool Coal Man hails from the first crop of the A.P. Indy stallion Mineshaft and represents his sire's first graded stakes winner. Mineshaft, the Eclipse Award winner as Horse of the Year in 2003, stands for \$75,000 at William S. Farish's Lane's End in Versailles, Kentucky.

Cool Coal Man is the fourth winner from five

starters out of the Rubiano mare Coral Sea, who won four races as a three-year-old. His half sister, Kathleen's Reel, by Lemon Drop Kid,

was a restricted stakes winner at Delta Downs in 2007. He also has a two-year-old half brother by Langfuhr and a yearling full brother.

At the heart of our subject's immediate family is his stakes-placed grandam, South Sea Dancer, a full sister to champion and influential sire Storm Bird and Northernette, a champion filly in Canada at both two and three.

Rubiano broodmares have combined to produce eight graded stakes winners through Tuesday. This includes multiple Grade 2 winner Teammate, by A.P. Indy, and multiple Grade 3 winner Ecclesiastic, by the A.P. Indy stallion Pulpit.

Cool Coal Man's pedigree also is quite similar to that of A.P. Warrior, a multiple Grade-2 winning colt as a three-year-old in 2006 who was sired by A.P. Indy. A.P. Warrior is out of a Fappiano-line mare, who was closely inbred to Mr. Prospector and whose second dam was a three-quarter sister to South Sea Dancer and her illustrious lot.
