



Golden Spikes reveals influence of Sequence's lineage

Improving sophomore colt Golden Spikes scored his first graded stakes victory when he rallied late to win by three-quarters of a length in the six-furlong Carry Back Stakes (G2) at Calder Race Course on July 12.

The bay Seeking the Gold colt entered off a head victory in the Unbridled Stakes, also at six furlongs, at Calder on June 14. The colt's best effort from four previous graded stakes appearances had been a second-place finish in the Illinois Derby (G2), on April 5.

Golden Spikes has won four of ten lifetime starts and earned \$372,095. All four of his wins have come in sprints at Calder.

He is being pointed toward the King's Bishop Stakes (G1) on August 23 at Saratoga Race Course.

Golden Spikes hails from the 15th crop of Seeking the Gold and represents his sire's 48th graded or group stakes winner.

Seeking the Gold stands at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky, for a 2008 fee of \$125,000. Purchased for \$250,000 at the 2006 Keeneland September yearling sale, Golden Spikes was bred in Kentucky by Robert S. Evans, who also bred his first three dams along with much of his distinguished immediate family.

Golden Spikes is the first starter of the A.P. Indy mare A. P. Interest, a maiden winner at age three.

A. P. Interest also is the dam of unraced two-year-old filly Credit Quality, by Elusive Quality, and an unnamed yearling colt by Distorted Humor.

Golden Spike's second dam, 1993 Ruffian Handicap (G1) winner Shared Interest, produced Grade 1 winner and sire Forestry, by Storm Cat, and 1999 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Cash Run, a daughter of Seeking the Gold and thus a three-quarter sibling to Golden Spikes.

Golden Spike's third dam, Surgery, is the dam of 1989 and '90 Vosburgh Stakes (G1) winner and sire Sewickley.

Golden Spike's stakes-winning fifth dam, Sequence, proved to be the most important producing granddaughter of the great American

matriarch Myrtlewood. Sequence's greatest influence on the breed is as the grandam of the foundation stallion Mr. Prospector, who appears in Golden Spike's pedigree as his paternal grandsire. This creates 4x5 inbreeding to Sequence. Adding A.P. Indy's sire, Seattle Slew, to the equation provides a third distant strain of Myrtlewood.

Reinforcement of the tail-female line, especially to one as worthy as Myrtlewood or Sequence, has long been a recipe for success.
